RING SIZE GUIDE

If you already own a John Rader ring, your size will be consistent across all of our collections. If you do not own a John Rader ring, please follow the steps below to determine your size.

HOW TO MEASURE YOUR RING SIZE

1. Wrap a piece of string snugly around the base of your finger.
2. Note the point on the string where the ends meet by marking it with a pen.
3. Use a ruler to measure the string in millimeters. This measurement is your suggested ring size. Please measure your knuckle as well to ensure the ring will slide on and off comfortably.

Note: Your finger size can change depending on the time of day and the climate you are in. We suggest measuring your finger at different times of the day to ensure the most accurate measurement. Please do not measure your finger when it is cold or wet, since this is when it will be at its smallest.

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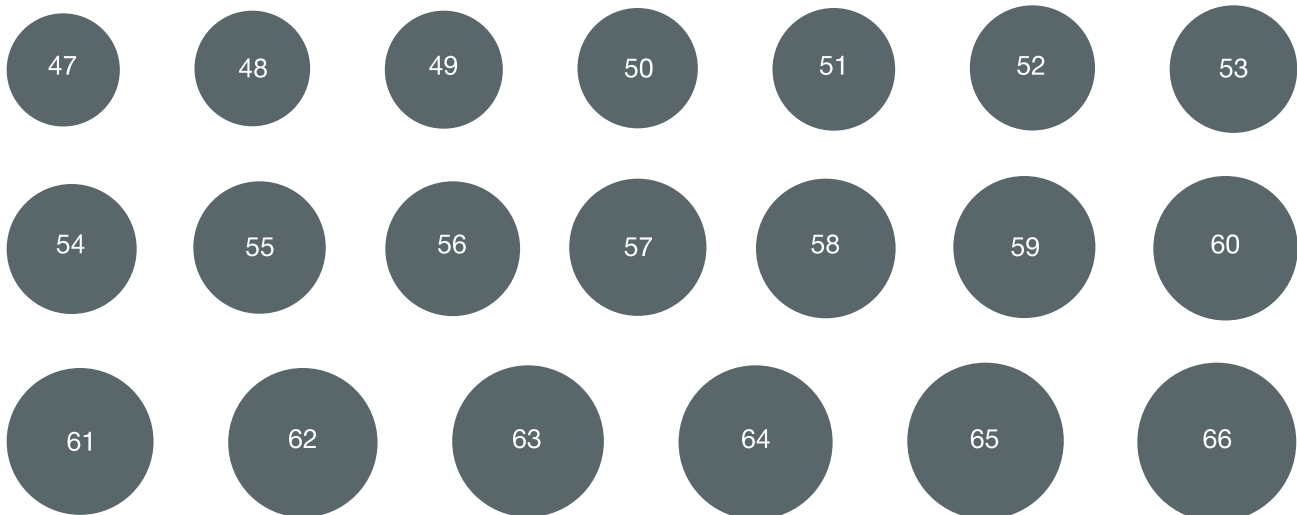
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RING SIZE REFERENCE

We highly suggest that you measure the size of your finger and not the size of a ring you currently own to determine your most accurate size. However, you may measure a ring you currently own that is in a similar width to the John Rader ring you wish to purchase by using the size references below. Note, these references measure the inside of the ring, not the outside (in mm).

Please ensure this guide is printed on US Letter size paper (8.5" x 11") and scaled to 100%. You may confirm your print size below.
